		(3) Response papers (25%): one-page paper asking questions about assigned readings (once a week)
		(4) Final Essay (10%): One-page essay reflecting on lecture themes and materials. Students will be asked to think over what
		they have learned through the class and how it has changed their views on Korean society.
		(5) Attendance (20%): Students will have 10 points deducted for each instance of unauthorized absence, and those who are
		absent without permission more than 4 times will not be able to complete the course.
